2. River COG March 13 meeting update:

Discussed, what projects could we do as a Tri-town area

Solarize, with Lindsay Towswitch as prime leader. She will be contacting vendors and try to gauge their interest in participating. Jeff to keep in touch with Lindsay

Quiet Lawns—this has been introduced in some towns. More consideration to follow

Pollinator Pathways – Coordinate with garden clubs? Perhaps sponsor a plant sale?

Styrofoam reduction: One target audience would be take-out diners. Perhaps develop a certification, or award program, for local restaurants? Would be issued if the restaurant had sustainable packaging for takeout, per a defined standard. Branding, and stickers, would be Tri-town in nature

Unit based pricing again – explore more models than were considered in the Deep River pilot . Many towns have been able to implement with a lighter touch

Light Out campaign . Gateway commission had a successful program, but was limited to migration time periods and non-residential buildings
