Blasting Permit Fees accounted for \$360.00 in Revenue, there were no fines levied for False Alarms.

Each month this office submits the Management Activity Report for the Fire Department, which is sent to the Bureau of State Fire Marshal for the National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS).

Training is required to maintain certification, which is provided by the Bureau of State Fire Marshal In-Service Programs.

Tent events require a permit for each event and a fee of \$30.00. The Fire Marshal inspects all tents prior to the event and determines the extent of fire protection needed.
