

Town of Deep River, CT Position: Inland Wetland Officer

Part time employment position that performs responsible independent technical work involving the monitoring and enforcement of inland wetlands and watercourses. Review and analyzes site plans, subdivision and other land use plans for compliance and conformance with state law and Town regulations and monitors construction activities for required soil retention and erosion control. Issues cease and desist orders and works with property owners or developers to remedy wetlands violations. Assists the Conservation and Inland Wetlands Commission of the Town of Deep River and other Commissions as needed.

Hours: 3-5 hours a week or as needed. Compensation hourly = \$28.00 hr.

Desired Minimum Qualifications:

- 1. Bachelor's degree in Environmental Science, Ecology, Urban Planning or some closely related field or at least two years of relevant experience dealing with wetlands evaluation and management or the management of natural resources.
- 2. Prior experience in the practices of preserving, protection, mainline and use of the Inland Wetlands and Watercourse and the use and application of soil erosion control measures.
- 3. Excellent communication skills required, and an ability to maintain confidential information, to maintain effective working relationships, and to provide regular monthly status reports to the Inland Wetlands Commission concerning enforcement efforts and status of monitoring of construction efforts.
- 4. Ability to maintain set office hours each week so available to the public, and the ability upon the receipt of applications to calculate and collect requisite permit fees.
- 5. A valued license for the Connecticut Department of Motor Vehicles.
- 6. Certification as a Soil Scientist is highly preferred.
- 7. Completion of the State of Connecticut Municipal Inland's Wetlands and Watercourses training program prior to hiring or within four months of hiring.
- 8. Completion of the State of Connecticut Aquifer Protection Technical training within four months of hiring
- 9. Completion of a seminar or similar educational training provided by the state concerning the Freedom of Information Act.
- 10. Physical demands of occasionally required to sit, climb, balance, stoop, kneel crouch or crawl, lift and/or move up to 50 pounds, reach which hands, stand walk, use hands to finger, and use tools or controls.
