MOLD REMEDIATION REFERENDUM
March 26, 2024

A mold remediation referendum of electors and citizens qualified to vote at Town Meetings in the Town of Deep River was legally warned in the March 14, 2024 issue of the Valley Courier. The referendum was held in the Community Meeting Room at the Deep River Public Library, 150 Main Street, Deep River, on Tuesday, March 26, 2024, between the hours of 6 a.m. and 8 p.m. for the approval of one question. Poll voting was done by ballot tabulator while absentee ballots were counted by hand. A total of 581 votes were counted including 4 non-registered property owners and 25 absentee ballots. The total number of registered voters on the current list was 3,323. Voter turnout was 17%. Kirk Lowry served as moderator.

“Shall Regional School District No. 4, comprised of the Towns of Chester, Deep River and Essex, appropriate \$5,800,000 for the remediation of a mold outbreak, repairs to the heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) system and dehumidification services at John Winthrop Middle School and authorize the issuance of bonds, notes or temporary notes in an amount not to exceed \$5,800,000 to finance the appropriation?”

Question was passed by 532 votes.
